

The regular meeting of the Adams Township Board of Supervisors was held on April 11, 2022 at 7:00 P.M. at the Adams Township Municipal Building, 690 Valencia Road, Adams Township, Mars, PA.

Present at the meeting were Supervisors Russell R. Ford, Ronald J. Shemela, Edward L. Vogel, Ronald G. Nacey and Darryl M. Brandon; Solicitor Michael Gallagher, Township Manager Gary Peaco, Chief of Police Shawn Anglum, Park Director Haley Zaliponi and Assistant Secretary Andrea Dunton.

Chairman Ford called the meeting to order at 7:15 P.M. with the Pledge of Allegiance.
